WHEREAS, the mission and work of the Ovarian Cancer Awareness Foundation is to be commended; and

WHEREAS, we salute the survivors of this disease and those who support them;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September, 2014 as

Ovarian Cancer Hwareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
