## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, in the United States, an estimated 1.1 million people are living with, or are in remission from, leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma or another form of blood cancer; with an estimated 156,420 new cases expected to be diagnosed in 2014, and

WHEREAS, leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma and other blood cancers will kill an estimated 55,350 people in the United States this year alone, and

WHEREAS, The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS), exists to find cures and ensure access to treatments for blood cancer patients, and

WHEREAS, LLS maintains a state office in Nashville to help improve the quality of life for blood cancer patients and their families in the State of Tennessee, and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee is similarly committed to the eradication of these diseases and supports the treatment of blood cancer patients and their families, and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee encourages private efforts to enhance research funding and education programs that address these diseases;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 2014 as

Leukemia, Lymphoma, and Myeloma Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
