PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the history of the State of Tennessee was strongly influenced by our Native American Indian tribes; and

WHEREAS, the contributions of the American Indians have enhanced the freedom, prosperity, and greatness of our state and nation; and

WHEREAS, their customs and traditions are respected and celebrated as part of a rich legacy throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, Native American Awareness Week began in 1976 and recognition was expanded by Congress and approved by George H. W. Bush in August 1990; designating the month of November as National American Indian Heritage Month; and

WHEREAS, in honor of National American Heritage Month, community celebrations as well as numerous cultural, artistic, educational and historical activities have been planned;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of November, 2014 as

Native American Heritage Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
