P R O C L A M A T I O N
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Charcot-Marie-Tooth (CMT) is the most common inherited peripheral neuropathy disorder, affecting approximately 1 in 2,500 people worldwide, and approximately 2,500 people in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, CMT is characterized by a slow and progressive degeneration of the muscles in the foot, lower leg, and forearm, extending to weakness in the hands and loss of muscle tone; and

WHEREAS, Vanderbilt University Medical Center is now designated as the Center for Excellence on CMT with patients coming from Kentucky, Indiana, Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana and North Carolina and hosting a Family Conference; and

WHEREAS, the past year has brought significant strides thru the Charcot-Marie-Tooth Association's (CMTA) STAR (Strategy to Accelerate Research) Initiative research and development of therapies for CMT to include the new research grant given to Belmont University for research on treatments; and

WHEREAS, through an innovative public-private partnership combining the National Institutes of Health and university laboratories with expertise in peripheral nerve biology, scientist have identified candidates drugs with potential to begin human clinical trials for the treatment of the most common type of CMT; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the CMTA is to provide grassroots support for local citizens facing the daily challenges of living with CMT to include now having CMT branches in two cities in Tennessee and more to come in the year 2015 by encouraging local members of the community to rally around their neighbors and make a commitment to educating the public about CMT;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 2015 as

Charcot-Marie-Tooth Awareness Month

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
