PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, syringomyelia, often referred to as SM, is a chronic disorder involving the spinal cord; and

WHEREAS, this condition occurs when cerebrospinal fluid, normally found outside of the spinal cord and brain, enters the interior of the spinal cord, forming a cavity known as a syrinx; and

WHEREAS, many individuals suffer from severe and debilitating symptoms including chronic pain, headaches, and paralysis; and

WHEREAS, the need for widespread awareness and understanding for syringomyelia is critical for meaningful research to continue so that we may improve the quality of life for those diagnosed and look towards a cure; and

WHEREAS, the American Syringomyelia & Chiari Alliance Project, Inc., the oldest non-profit organization providing support for individuals facing chiari and syringomyelia, will celebrate May as the official month for Syringomyelia Awareness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of May, 2015 as
