## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, during World War I, a banner displaying a blue star in a field of white and red represented family members serving in the armed forces, only to be replaced by a gold star when a loved one was lost; and

WHEREAS, in 1936, our nation saw the first observance of Gold Star Mother's Day, and by the end of World War II the Gold Star Wives had been formed; and

WHEREAS, the family members who put our country ahead of their own needs, carry the devastating heartache and pain of losing their loved one while in service; and

WHEREAS, despite the pain and loss that they have suffered, these families carry on with the same pride and steadfastness shown by the their loved one who made the greatest sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the mothers and wives, all family members preserve the memories of the brave men and women who have been lost by serving their communities and striving for a better future with great courage and spirit; and

WHEREAS, we must honor the great strength and compassion shown by these families as they deal with the loss of their own loved while giving comfort and support to the men and women still serving in the Armed Forces and their families; and

WHEREAS, as we celebrate the memories of our Soldiers, Marines, Sailors, and Airmen who served and died for our freedom, let us remember and pay tribute to the parents, spouses, children, grandparents, and other family members left behind who are also paying an immeasurable price; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim May 15, 2015 as

Gold Star Family Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
