PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, as Military Governor of the State of Tennessee President Andrew Johnson freed his personal slaves on August 8, 1863; and

WHEREAS, August 8th was a day to celebrate freedom in African American communities beginning in East Tennessee and gaining in popularity across the state in the 1800's; and

WHEREAS, every American deserves the rights and freedoms afforded to them through the United States Constitution and given to them by Tennessee State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting to honor and remember a day that brought about freedom from bondage and slavery;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim August 8, 2015, as

Emancipation Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
