## PROCLAMATION

## BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, millions of people worldwide have genetic or chromosomal disorders; and

WHEREAS, today, testing is available to identify those children and adults who have duplications of the material on their 15<sup>th</sup> chromosome (dup15q) specifically isodicentric, interstitial, mosaic, edge, and microduplications; and

WHEREAS, it is important to acknowledge there is a wide range of severity in the developmental disabilities that may be experienced by individuals with these types of duplications; and

WHEREAS, here in Tennessee, there are many families that struggle daily with the challenges of Dup15q - typically, delays in gross motor skills, fine motor skills, cognition, and speech and language, as well as diagnosis of autism spectrum disorders and/or attention deficit disorders, seizures, behavioral challenges, and anxiety; and

WHEREAS, the Dup15q Alliance, an international organization, was created in 1994 to provide support to families of "Dupers" and to promote research;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim September 13, 2015 as

Dup 15q Hwareness Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
