PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Code Annotated 15-2-101 states that it is the duty of the Governor to proclaim January 19 as Robert E. Lee Day; and

WHEREAS, General Robert E. Lee, born on January 19, 1807, was a world-renowned military leader of the Confederate States of America, and

WHEREAS, later General Lee served as President of what would become Washington & Lee University; and

WHEREAS, as a leader in war and a leader in peace, was -- and continues to be - a sterling example of American leadership, inspiration, and honor; and

WHEREAS, Woodrow Wilson said of Robert E. Lee, "This man was not great because he was born of a soldier and bred in a school of soldiers, but because of whosoever he may have been born and howsoever he was bred; he was a man who saw his duty, who conceived it in high terms and who spent himself, not upon his own ambitions, but in the duty that lay before him."

WHEREAS, it is fitting that this distinguished man be remembered and honored, as always, and especially so during January, his birth month;

NOW THEREFORE, I Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim January 19, 2016 as

Robert E. Lee Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
