PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the United States responded to the invasion and annexation of Kuwait by Saddam Hussein, along with forces from 34 nations, with Operation Desert Storm; and

WHEREAS, since the birth of this great nation, millions of brave American men and women have courageously answered the call to defend their country's ideals of freedom and democracy; and

WHEREAS, after five weeks of aerial bombardment, ground troops waged a campaign on the occupying Iraqi forces in Kuwait; and

WHEREAS, after four days the city of Kuwait once again raised the Emirate's flag and a cease-fire was called; and

WHEREAS, the United States of America were prepared to come to the aid of Saudi Arabia with efficient and effective military technology thanks to the foresight and preparedness of our great Country's Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, twenty five years ago, over 500,000 members of the United States Armed Forces risked their lives in the Persian Gulf to liberate Kuwait during Operation Desert Storm, some making the ultimate sacrifice for their country; and

WHEREAS, 146 Americans were killed in support of Operation Desert Storm, which includes five Tennesseans; and

WHEREAS, the men and women who served in the United States Armed Forces during Operation Desert Storm have earned the gratitude and respect of their nation; and

WHEREAS, the observance of the 25th anniversary of Operation Desert Storm allows citizens throughout Tennessee, and across our country, the opportunity to honor those who served during this conflict for their valor and selflessness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim February 28, 2016 as

Desert Storm Remembrance Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
