PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, mediation in Tennessee continues to grow and assist citizens and the courts in alternative dispute resolution; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 31 was enacted in January 1996 to establish court-based alternative dispute resolution on a statewide basis; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Rule 31's promulgation, there are more than 1,200 Rule 31 mediators in Tennessee who have reported serving as conflict resolution professionals in 5,377 mediations in calendar year 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly and the Administrative Office of the Courts support nine state-funded Victim Offender Reconciliation Program (VORP) centers; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee wishes to acknowledge the contribution of mediation and encourage its further growth; and

WHEREAS, on April 8, 2016 mediators are gathering for conflict resolution training at the annual meeting of the Tennessee Association of Professional Mediators (TAPM) and presentation of the Grayfred Gray Public Service in Mediation Award by the Coalition of Mediation Awareness in Tennessee to Margaret M. Huff;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Haslam, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April 8, 2016 as

Mediation Day

in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
